

## A note from the CUB SCOUTS:

This is our first Cub Scout Pack entry in Post 148's newsletter. Cub Scout Pack 606 wants to take this opportunity to say thanks to the American Legion for all its support, provide a brief overview of Scouting, and how we contribute to the Legion's overall mission.

Cub Scouts is the elementary school-age initial level into Boy Scouts of America (BSA). The Legion has a long and rich history of supporting Scouting across the country. Congress created the BSA in 1909 and then the American Legion in 1916. The Legion's very first national convention was in 1919. One of the first ever resolutions in 1919 was to charter and support BSA units as an extension of the Legion's Americanism, nation



resolutions in 1919 was to charter and support BSA units as an extension of the Legion's Americanism, national security, and community service mission. The Legion is approaching its centennial year of chartering BSA units. Cub Scout Pack 606 has existed since 1993. The American Legion Alafia Post 148 adopted Pack 606 as a Post program in 2006. In 2015, Pack 606 was the largest Legion-sponsored BSA unit in the entire state of Florida out of 83 units and over 3,000 registered Scout members.

During the first Great War, World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, and the Cold War, Scouts served as an integral part of US Civil Defenses. Scouts raised money for the federal government through War Bond drives, organized scrap metal drives for war materials, assisted as couriers and coastal watchers, etc. Generations of patriotic American Legion members who could no longer serve abroad in the military led Scouting units at home during the domestic wartime mobilization periods.

Today is no different than the past! We are a nation at war abroad and domestically. Overseas our military is fighting terrorists and non-state actors. We face a major rising economic and military competitors, rogue nations with nuclear weapons, and an old foe with a hostile and revisionist agenda. Our military is deployed worldwide countering these threats. Likewise, at home in the USA, we are in the midst of a culture war. The family unit is being distorted and torn apart. Foundational values and principles are being diluted on a regular basis. The fabric that makes our country strong is fraying. That's where BSA fits into the Legion's mission. We may not be able to suit-up for battle and deploy, but we have leadership and wisdom to pass on to the next generation. That's where the Legionnaires, Auxiliary, Sons, Riders, and Marine Corp League members have a calling:

## WE NEED YOU!

BSA, with strong leadership and support from the Legion, actively gains placement and access to the local community; strengthens family relationships; demonstrates duty to God and Country; teaches the next generation of young men leadership principles and citizenship; instills our traditional values such as respect and manners; promotes physical fitness and outdoor skills; teaches Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM); and serves the community.

The Cub Scout Pack currently has a need for Alafia Post members of all units to assist with: coordinating service projects; spring pinewood derby race committee; outdoor activities; various holiday party planning; assisting with leading/teaching 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> graders; assisting with simple flag etiquette and color guard ceremonies; coordinating flag retirements at campouts; planning outdoor adventures; monitoring unit activities for both BSA's Journey to Excellence annual report and the Legion's Consolidated Post Report (CPR); and assisting with popcorn booth sales.

Any Post 148 member is always welcome and encouraged to attend our monthly Pack 606 Awards meetings on the 4th Wednesday of the month. This is a time where the boys, families, and leaders are recognized for their accomplishments. It is a fun time with skits, awards, and other fun activities. Our Scouts will be in their dress uniforms on that evening to receive their recognition and you are highly encouraged to wear your official white Legion uniform shirt and hat. Your Legion polo shirt or Rider vest is appropriate for all other meetings/activities. The Pack also encourages Legion participation with our flag retirements, campfires, the annual Blue & Gold Banquet in February, graduation in May, and other outings.
