



- A 1967 Flag study manual explained that the red in the U.S. Flag stands for courage, valor, and strength; the blue represents truth, loyalty, and fidelity; the white conveys purity, light, and peace.
- In 1942, Congress established the practice of placing your right hand over your heart when reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.




